As Vice-President - Special Projects it is my privilege to work with Michelle Kerr, the dedicated members of the Board and so many member-volunteers who so generously provide their time and wise counsel.

GRANT APPLICATIONS:

SERVICE CANADA – SUMMER EMPLOYMENT GRANT:

The Club received a Sumer Employment Grant of \$3,522.35 from Service Canada. This was based on employment for eight weeks. We have applied for a 16-week grant for 2018.

ONTARIO TRILLIUM FOUNDATION: The club has applied for a grant from the Ontario Trillium foundation for \$67,200 to re-fit six eight person shells used for the Adult Recreational and Youth Rowing School programs. We expect to hear about this grant around March 1.

ONTARIO – SUMMER EXPERIENCE PROGRAM: We were not successful in getting this grant in 2017 – usually about \$2750.00 and directed to the Youth Rowing School. We plan to re-apply in 2018.
