EVENTS

With thanks to Kate Hingston, we had two successful events at the HIH Patio. The first, in July, hosted by Rick Crooker, was a thank-you to our coaches – so well attended. The second was a visit from Kristen Kit, coxswain of the Women's Gold Medal Eight at the 2020 (in 2021) Tokyo Olympics. Kristen, who rowed for Sir Winston Churchill Secondary School and for St. Catharines, talked about her experience with the National Team and the Olympics, and spent time circulating and chatting with our U17 AND U19 athletes.

We are hoping that COVID protocols will allow us to have 2022 Tag Day and a Mother's Day Plant Sale in May, a Christening in June, "Come Home to Henley" in August, and the Captain's Dinner in November.
